

Where prioritization may be necessary in implementing or interpreting this Constitution the priorities are:

1. Life of innocent individuals, citizens or not
2. Human rights
3. Survival of the nation
4. Citizen rights
5. Health and welfare of citizens
6. Citizen participation in Government
7. Effective operation of Government
8. Efficient operation of Government

The National Anthem shall be *God Bless America*.

Human Rights

1. To be respected as a human, regardless of race, color, sex or physical capability.
2. To be free from involuntary servitude, except when as punishment for a convicted crime.
3. To determine one's own course in life when not interfering with the lives of others.
4. To believe as one wishes, without prejudice.
5. To be free from physical or mental torture.
6. To defend the lives of self and family.
7. To partner and practice natural partner acts in private.
8. To a peaceful old age.
9. To a fair trial by jury with no punishment before a trial.
10. To acquire, possess and protect property.
11. To work for the benefit of self and family.
12. To just compensation and restitution for injurious acts.
13. To end one's own life without interference.
14. To have one's earthly remains disposed of as he/she desires.

Citizen Rights

1. To free speech and writing that does not lie or threaten or tell falsehood about another.
2. To freedom of assembly for peaceful purpose.
3. To religious belief and religious practices that do not interfere with the religious rights/practices of others.
4. To make known perceived wrongs without retribution.
5. To justice and compensation for violations of human or citizen rights.
6. To secret vote without harassment or threat of personal harm or payment to vote.
7. To education that benefits self, family, community, nation.
8. To community health benefits.
9. To provide and exchange truthful information with others.
10. To privacy and protection from unreasonable search and seizure in their home or on their person.
11. To freedom from false imprisonment.
12. To rapid public local trial by a jury of nine unbiased peers in a court of law.
13. To fair bail and legal representation.
14. To full access of accusing information and to face and question accusers.
15. To freedom from excessive fines and cruel and unusual punishments.

16. To freedom from harassment when found not-guilty of a charged crime.
17. To just compensation for property or goods seized by a government agency for the betterment of society.

Threats

Spoken, written or any form of physical threat are not protected by any Human or Citizen rights.

Congress

1. Every law imposed on United States citizens shall be applicable to the members of Congress. Congress shall have no laws applicable only to itself.
 2. Every member of Congress must read each proposed law before it is presented for vote, and affirm that he/she understands the intent and consequences of the law.
 7. Each capable Congress-member shall sign a pledge to perform the duties for which elected, for the term for which elected. Violation of the pledge shall be considered a major crime.
 9. Job descriptions in simple language understandable by the general public shall be prepared for the leadership positions in Congress and for general representation in Congress (Senator and Representative). Violation of the job descriptions by persons in Congress shall be a basis for removal from office.

Constitutional Council

4. No Federal law shall be in effect until approved by the Constitutional Council.

Budget

A wise individual, a wise family, a wise organization, a wise country carefully balances income, expenses, and reserves for the unexpected.

1. The Federal government shall operate on a 2-year balanced budget
 2. The budget shall include a reserve of at least 5% for unforeseen events, including natural or manmade disasters.
 3. The budget shall include a reduction of any national debt by at least 10% with the goal of achieving a future balanced budget with no national debt.
 4. The President may reject one or more budget individual items and still allow the remainder of the budget to be in effect as long as the remaining budget is balanced and with at least a 5% reserve.

Foreign Policy

3. A tenet of humanity is that life is the most precious thing we have regardless of where we live in the world. However, the U.S. is neither the world policeman nor the world benefactor. The U.S. shall not enter into any alliance or agreement which may require military support or unbudgeted financing.

4. Foreign aid shall be included in the national budget as a line item for each country to receive such aid. Foreign aid shall be classified as: (1) a loan, to be paid-back by a specific date with a specified interest rate, (2) no expectation of refund (e.g. natural disaster relief). Total foreign aid shall not exceed 1% of the current national budget. Where a refund schedule has not been met, no further foreign aid to that country shall be allowed until the loan has been repaid in full.

5. No foreign entity shall be allowed to own or control more than 2% of the total resources of the United States, including but not limited to land, human elements, materials, structures, companies, physical assets and technology.

Voting

2. Knowledge about candidates and issues and the voting process is critical to intelligent voting. Public education about voting, the democratic process, and how to be an intelligent voter shall be uniform nation-wide. Voters must show they have had such training. Citizens may not vote without having had such training.

7. Major factors to be considered for any candidate for public office are:

- a. demonstrated honesty and personal integrity,
- b. demonstrated capability to look at facts and think logically about issues,
- c. demonstrated knowledge applicable to the position being sought,
- d. demonstrated experience applicable to the position being sought.

8. Providing false information to the public about a candidate or issue is a crime.

Crime

One crime can affect many and is a burden on national resources.

7. Any U.S. citizen who commits a Major Crime shall be buried in a Criminals Cemetery upon his/her death. Any non-citizen who commits a Major Crime on United States territory shall be buried upon his/her death in a Criminals Cemetery specifically designated for non-citizens.

8. For Major Crimes, all personal wealth of the criminal and all family wealth attributed to the crimes shall be confiscated and assigned to the Federal Treasury

Language

In today's global environment many languages may be found in a nation.

1. English shall be the official spoken and written language of the United States. All citizens shall be capable of communicating in English. All those applying for citizenship shall be afforded the opportunity to learn English.

2. All legal transactions and all communications involving compliance with the federal and state laws shall be in English.

3. Other languages may be used in community life to preserve historical customs and to promote understanding of the requirements of laws.
